VOICE FROM THE PEWS

Where Scripture meets real life

Two simple photographs taken last year tell a profound story of faith, presence, and mission.

The first image was taken from the General Curia of the Augustinians, just across St. Peter's Square, looking toward the Papal Palace. It was a time of preparation—the Church was busy setting up for the installation mass of Pope Leo XIV. There was movement everywhere: people working, organising, preparing for a moment of great significance in the life of the Church.

And yet, above all the activity, the sky seemed to speak. The clouds formed in such a way that they resembled a pair of eyes—watching over the Church. It was a brief but powerful moment, a quiet reminder: God sees. God is present. God is with His people.

The second image captures what happened next. It was taken during a joyful gathering—the 70th birthday celebration of the then Prior General of the Augustinians, Fr Alejandro. Around the table were members of the Augustinian family: Pope Leo XIV himself, an Augustinian; Bishop Luis Marín; Fr Alejandro; and Fray Efen.

In that simple moment of fraternity, Fray Efen showed them on his mobile phone the photo he had taken—the image of the papal palace with those striking cloud “eyes.” Everyone leaned in, drawn into what they were seeing together. That moment soon became viral. Many who saw the image wondered: What captured their attention so completely? What were they looking at?

But for those at the table, the answer was simple. They were sharing a moment of wonder. They were recognising something beyond the image itself— a quiet sign that God is near, even in the midst of ordinary life. And in that scene, we also glimpse something beautiful: Augustinian brotherhood at its best. Pope, bishop, prior general, and brother—gathered not in formality, but in simplicity, closeness, and shared delight.

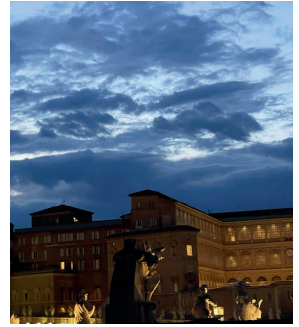
This is the heart of Pentecost. Pentecost is not only about wind and fire. It is about awakening. The Holy Spirit opens our eyes to see that God has been with us all along—in our work, in our community, in moments we might easily overlook. Just as those gathered around the table were drawn into that moment of discovery, the Spirit draws us into a deeper awareness: God is present here and now. And once we see, the Spirit sends us.

The disciples, once uncertain and afraid, were set on fire. They went forth with courage because they knew they were not alone.

So too for us: In our busy lives, God is present. In our simple gatherings, God reveals Himself. In our journey, God walks with us. Like the “eyes” in the sky, God watches over His Church—not from a distance, but with loving closeness. And like that moment around the table, we are invited to pause, to notice, and to be filled with wonder. Because when we truly recognise that God is with us, everything changes. Our fear becomes courage. Our routine becomes mission. Our hearts begin to burn.

This Pentecost, may we ask for that grace: to see, to believe, and to be sent. For we are not alone. We are seen. We are loved. And we are sent.

Happy Pentecost and happy birthday to the Church!

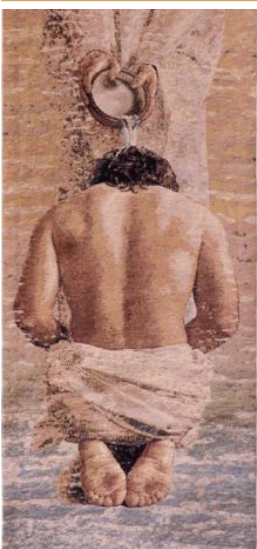

12 FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit are the visible signs of a life guided by the Holy Spirit. They reflect the attitudes and actions that grow within us as we draw closer to Christ and live according to God's will.

- Love – loving God and others selflessly
- Joy – deep happiness rooted in God's presence
- Peace – inner calm and trust in God
- Patience – enduring difficulties with grace
- Kindness – showing care and compassion to others
- Goodness – choosing what is right and holy
- Generosity – willingly sharing our time, gifts, and love
- Gentleness – acting with humility and tenderness
- Faithfulness – remaining loyal to God and others
- Modesty – living with humility and simplicity
- Self-Control – managing our thoughts, words, and actions wisely
- Chastity – loving with purity and respect according to our vocation

These fruits remind us that when the Holy Spirit is active in our lives, our faith is reflected not only in what we believe, but in how we live, love, and serve others.

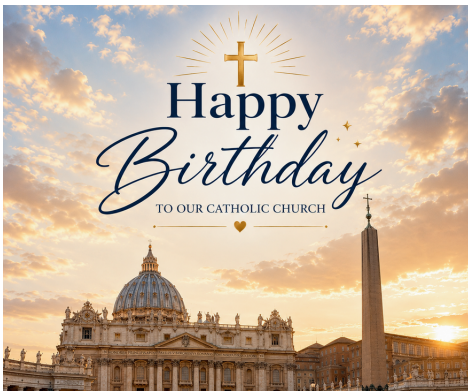


PENTECOST 101 7 GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Understanding deepens our grasp of the teachings of faith.
- Counsel guides us in making right decisions according to God's will.
- Fortitude gives us courage and strength to stand firm in faith, especially in difficult times.
- Knowledge helps us recognise God's presence and purpose in all things.
- Piety draws us into a loving relationship with God and inspires reverence in prayer and worship.
- Fear of the Lord fills us with awe and respect for God, leading us to avoid sin and live holy lives.

These gifts are strengthened within us through prayer, the sacraments, and openness to the Holy Spirit at work in our hearts.

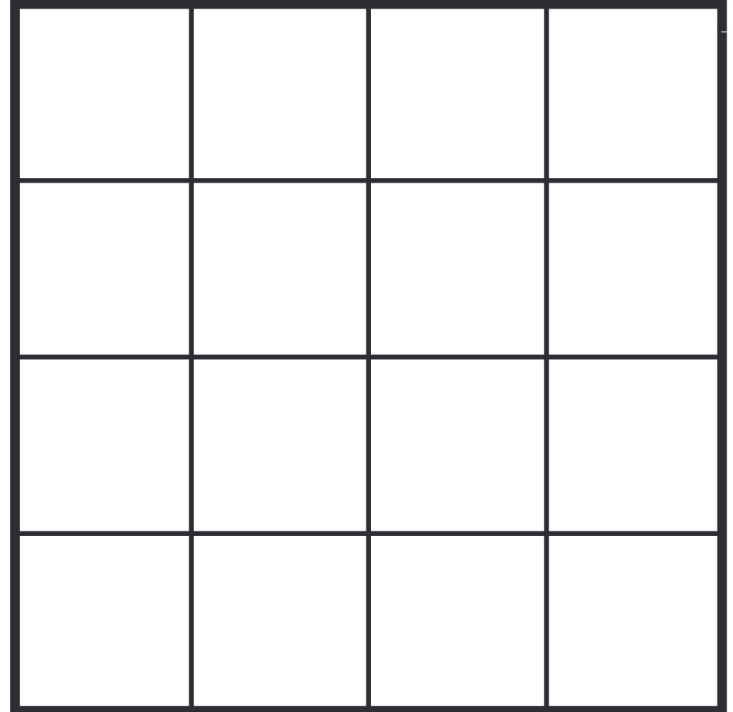
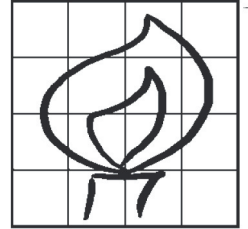
